medicinal products is growing continuously. Accordingly, several new products are also being introduced into the market. Though some herbal medicines have promising potential and are widely used, many of them remain untested and their uses are also not monitored. The general perception is that the herbal remedies or drugs are very safe and devoid of adverse effects. This makes knowledge of their potential adverse effects very limited and promotion of their rational use becomes difficult. It is reported that the use of herbal products and the perception of its safety stands doubtful, because herbs have been shown to be capable of producing a wide range of undesirable or adverse reactions, some of which are capable of causing serious injuries, life-threatening conditions, and even death also.
